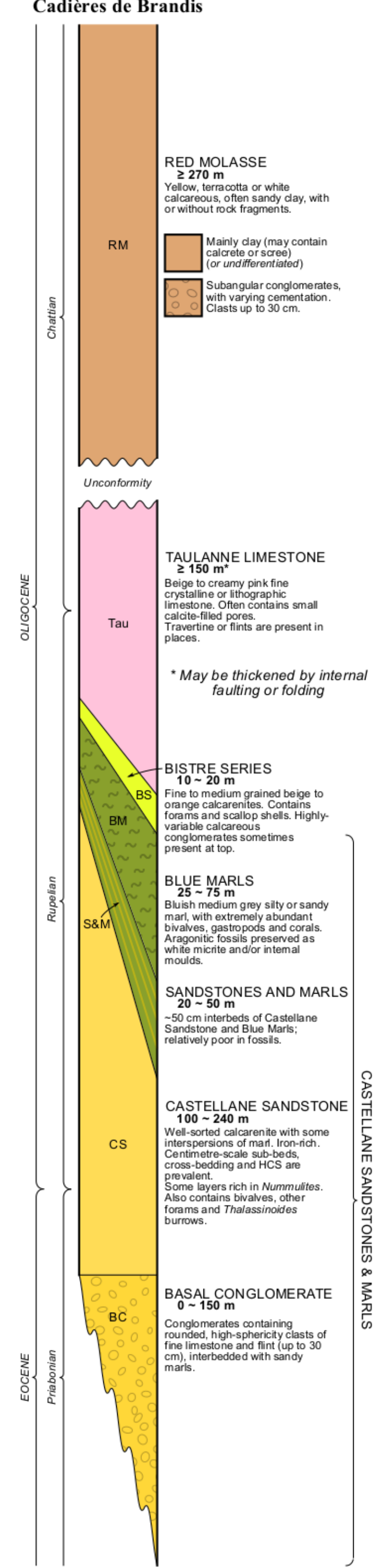

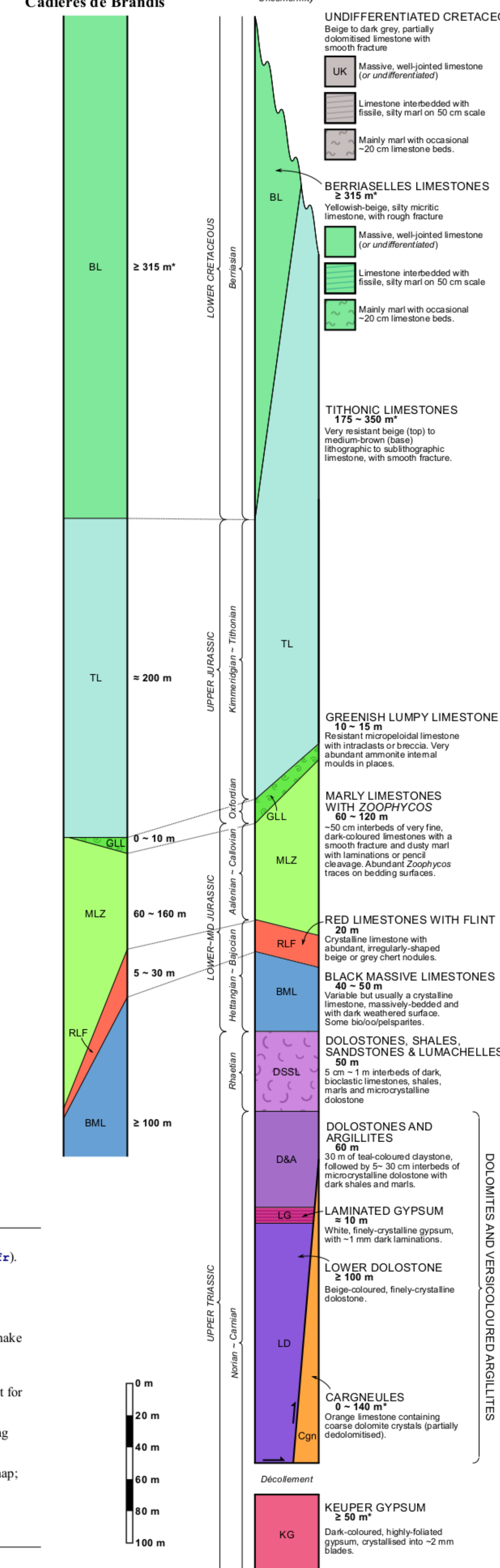


GENERALISED VERTICAL SECTION

Cadières de Brandis



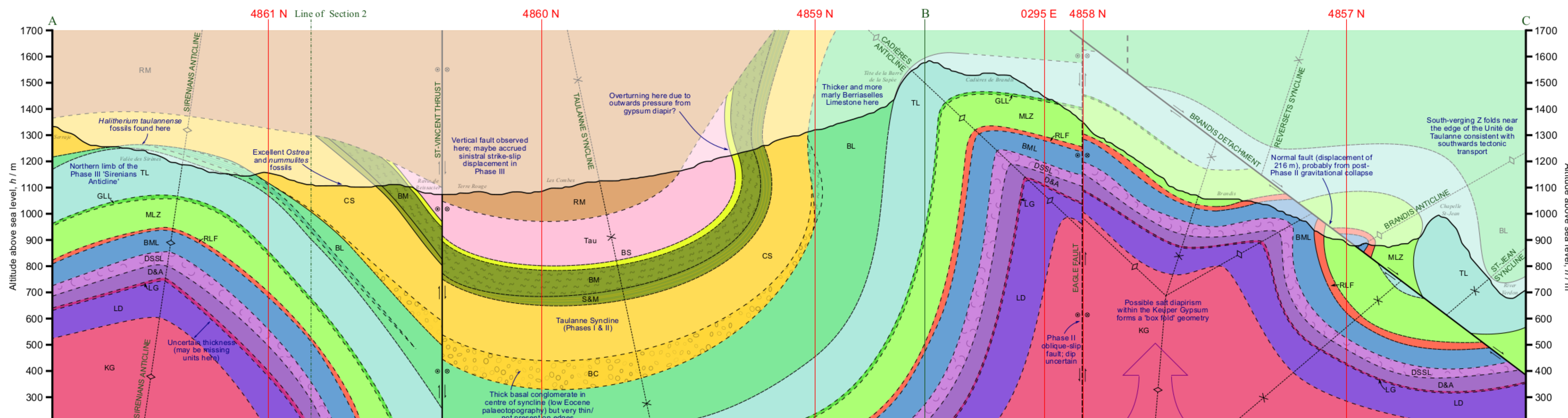
Succession South of the

CROSS-SECTIONS

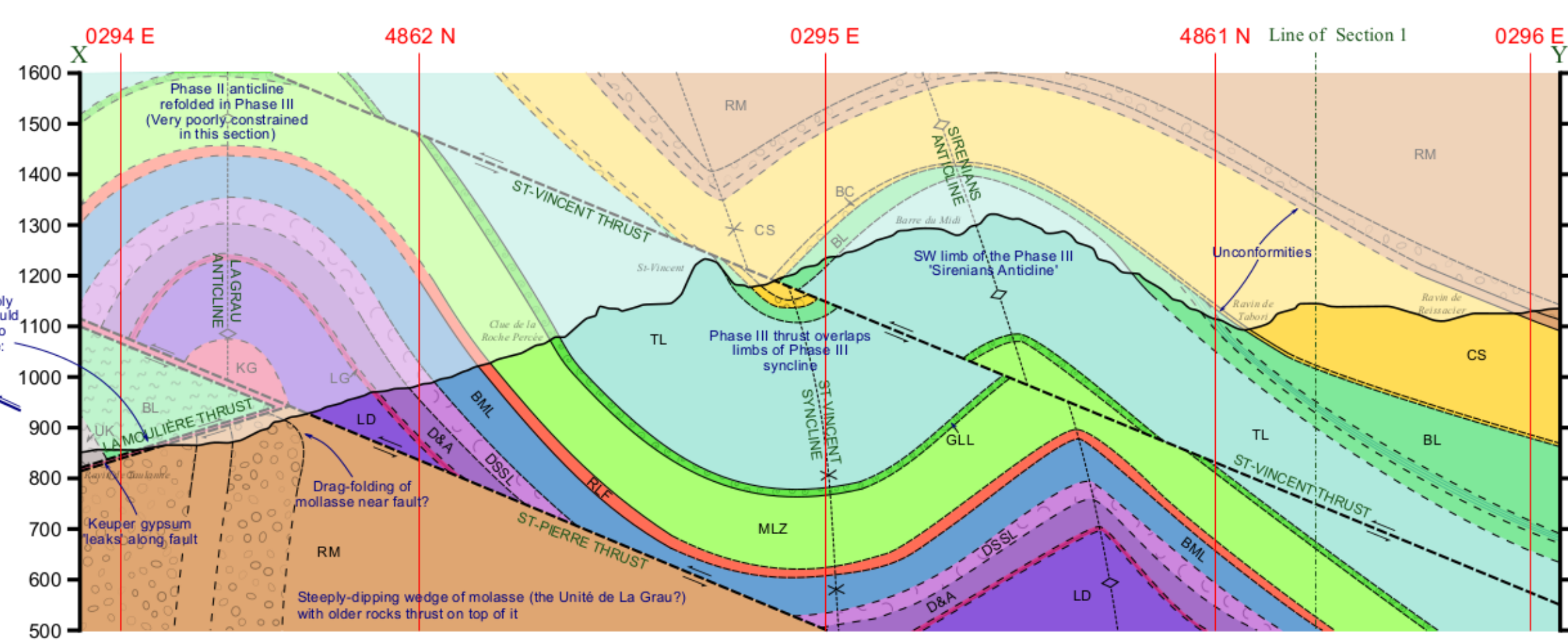
CROSS-SECTION 1: N - S
